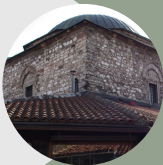


5 ANNEXES OF MUSEUM OF SARAJEVO

BRUSA BEZISTAN

Built in 1551 by Rustem Pasha, the Brusa Bezistan originally served as a silk market. Today, it houses the Museum of Sarajevo's Permanent Exhibition, presenting the city's history from prehistory to the Austro-Hungarian period.

DESPIĆ'S HOUSE

Once home to the wealthy Serbian Orthodox Despić family, Despić's House dates back to the 17th century. Today, it showcases the family's lifestyle and is notable as the site of Sarajevo's first theatre performances.

SVRZO'S HOUSE

Svrzo's House, built in the 18th century, preserves the architecture and lifestyle of a wealthy Bosnian Muslim family. Interestingly, its four separate buildings reflect the traditional organization of family life in Ottoman-era Sarajevo.

MUSEUM OF SARAJEVO 1878-1918

The Museum Sarajevo 1878-1918 presents the city during Austro-Hungarian rule through 17 thematic sections. It stands at the site of the 1914 Sarajevo Assassination, where Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife Sophie were killed.

THE JEWISH MUSEUM

The Jewish Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina is housed in Sarajevo's oldest synagogue, built in 1581. Once a year, during Rosh Hashanah, the museum becomes a place of prayer, symbolically continuing its centuries-old tradition.
